The children behaved impeccably, following instructions carefully and performing late in to the evening. Thank you to the many parents and carers who came along to support the children and to Mrs Murphy, Miss Ball and Miss Arundel for all their help preparing pupils for the show.

On the 19th of November, our class (Y5 CB) went to Warwick Arts' Centre to perform "The Armed Man" to mark a hundred years since World War I ended. Our class was chosen by Mrs Murphy because we are musically gifted. We practised for weeks and weeks but in the end our practice paid off!

We arrived at Warwick Arts' Centre at 3.00pm, by coach. It was very spacious and the hall we were performing in (The Butterworth Hall) had 1,083 seats. 

Reception/KSI Christmas Dinner

The Christmas lunch is free of charge for all pupils in Reception, Year One and Year Two. Please log in to your Parent Pay account by **Monday 26 November** and give consent under the *KS1 Christmas Dinner* item in order to book your child's meal.

KS2 Christmas Dinner

The Christmas lunch costs £2.20 per child for pupils in Years Three, Four, Five and Six. Please log in to your Parent Pay account by **Monday 26 November** and make payment under the *KS2 Christmas Dinner* payment item in order to book your child's meal.

For those children in KS2 who are entitled to a **free** school meal, we will automatically book your child a meal. Please contact the school office by **Monday 26 November** if you DO NOT want your child to have a Christmas meal.


If your child normally has a school dinner every day that you pay for, we will not automatically assume that they will be having a Christmas dinner on 17 December and consent/payment for this meal MUST be made separately to the appropriate payment item in Parent Pay.

Please note that we cannot accept any meal requests after Monday 26 November as the school kitchen cannot place any late food orders.

If you child is poorly on the day of the meal, unfortunately we cannot offer a refund as the food will already have been ordered.
