This year we are working in partnership with Warwick University and other local schools in the CV31 postcode area to create a south Leamington art's festival. The festival will happen during July 2017.

Different classes will be involved throughout the year in creating performing and visual works of art in response to events organised by Warwick Art's Centre. First off the starting blocks are Year Six who are working with performance artist Natalie Hart to create a piece of theatre in response to a production of "Macbeth" they recently watched at The Art's Centre.

Guided by Natalie, the children are exploring the character of Macduff using dramatic techniques such as thought tracking, freeze framing and "role on the wall." This work will culminate in a performance to parents in January complete with

















lights, live sound effects, film recordings, a smoke machine and rope work—hopefully! Parents/carers will be invited to attend the performance as well as children from other participating schools.



Please pop along and take a look and remember that we are only able to accept cash payments. See you there!




New Playground Toys

Thank you for supporting these trips at an expensive time of year.


Without your payments we are unable to run such visits which are a
