In our assemblies this week we have been thinking about learning heroes. On Monday, Miss Glenny shared a story she read in the newspaper about a nine year old school boy called Qu Sinian who has to do his home learning on a motorway flyover bridge! This is because Qu's family live in one room without adequate lighting. Amazingly, Qu is not deterred by these challenging circumstances and works outside until sundown on his studies. Because of his determination and hard work, he is making excellent progress and is well on the way to fulfilling his dream of becoming a doctor. What a learning hero!

On Tuesday, Miss Glenny read the picture book "Malala's Magic Pencil" which re-tells the life story of a more well known learning hero, Malala Yousafzai. As you may know, Malala has campaigned

for girls to be allowed access to education. Because of her work, in 2012 she was shot in the head by members of the Taliban who wished to silence her. Thankfully, Malala recovered from her awful injuries and is now living in Britain. She travels the world continuing her fight for girls' education and, in 2014, was awarded The Nobel Peace Prize in recognition of her work.

Every day we see lots of home grown learning heroes at Sydenham Primary School. Keep up the good work everyone!

"This new version of Julius Caesar is the perfect introduction to Shakespeare for 7 to 13 year olds.

A company of actors have travelled up and down the land performing their stories. Now they've arrived in your town to tell a tale of friendship and betrayal. Caesar, Rome's leader, has returned from war stronger than ever, but some of his followers are questioning his powers. The plotting continues...

Part of our First Encounters with Shakespeare series, these engaging adaptations are 90 minutes long, use Shakespeare's original language and ask audiences to participate in the story. They are a fantastic first step into Shakespeare for children, families and schools." (Royal Shakespeare Company, First Encounters website.)

On Monday 29th and Tuesday 30th January, the RSC are visiting Sydenham to rehearse and perform Julius Caesar, First Encounters. Pupils in Key Stage Two will be invited to watch the performance of this exciting play which they know and love thanks to the work undertaken during last term's Shake-speare Week.

Please note that use of the school halls will be severely restricted on January 29th and 30th due to rehearsals and the performance. This means we are unable to serve hot dinners to children unless they are in Reception. All children in Y1—6 will need to bring a packed lunch on these days (the school kitchen will provide a packed lunch for any child eligible for free school meals.)
