## Holidays in Term Time

As I am sure you are aware, regular and punctual attendance at school is a legal requirement. It is also essential if pupils are to meet their educational potential.

Following an attendance review, we have been advised by the Local Authority and our governing body to start issuing fixed penalty notices (fines) for unauthorised holidays during term time.

Whilst school remains sympathetic to the needs of some parents requesting holidays, current regulations state that the head teacher may **not** grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are "exceptional circumstances" that apply to that application. The law states that the head teacher should consider each application on a case-by-case basis and on its own merits. It is at the head teacher's discretion if the exceptional circumstances warrant the authorisation of the leave and should also determine the number of days the pupil should be absent for.

Guidance states: "Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Attendance, Compliance and Enforcement Service of Warwickshire County Council

Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices."




RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS

We have just begun the process of applying for the Rights Respecting School Award — an initiative led by the international charity Unicef. The award recognises schools where children "feel safe, nurtured and in control of their futures."

The award is based upon the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. It celebrates the work of schools "where children are respected, their talents are nurtured and they are able to thrive; where pupils led happy, healthy lives and are responsible, active citizens; where the Rights of the Child are put in to practice within the school and beyond."

As part of the award, pupils will be learning about their rights, putting them into practice every day. Rights will be taught, learned, practised, respected, protected and promoted. We hope this learning will enhance well being, good behaviour and positive relationships whilst improving awareness of injustice and encouraging equality, dignity, respect, non-discrimination and participation amongst the whole school community.
