
Homelearning


What brilliant homelearning—well done.






In the evening, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are invited back to school for a bed time story—more details on the next page.

As part of our World Book Day celebrations, on March 1st we are running a Bedtime Stories event for children in Reception, Y1 and Y2.


Pupils in these classes are invited back to school in their pyjamas from 6.15pm—7.00pm to enjoy a range of stories read by the teacher.
