# RSC Playmaker's Festival



## Parking

This is to ensure the safety of our pupils.

Occasionally, at the start and end of the day, our caretaker has to open the gates to allow delivery vehicles access to the school. This does **not** mean that families may also use the car park.

Thank you in anticipation of your cooperation in this matter. We appreciate you abiding by the school rules in order to keep our children safe.

### Photographs of your Child

As you know, all parents/carers have recently completed a Consent Form for the Recording and Use of Images. This is because the law about how we store and share your personal data (GDPR) changed on May 25th. If you informed us that you do not want your child's photograph to appear on the school website, from today, their face will be masked in any group shots featured in the newsletter by a "smiley" icon.

If you have not yet completed this form or wish to change your mind about how we use your child's picture, please inform the office.

### PE Kit

If you are buying new PE clothes for your child over the summer holiday, please remember that children must wear standard kit for all sports' lessons.

Pupils are expected to have black shorts, a plain red or white T shirt and trainers (not pumps.) For colder weather they will also need black jogging bottoms and a plain sweat top or hoody. Local supermarkets supply all these items at a reasonable price.

To avoid embarrassment to your child, please make sure that clothing is not too small. Please also avoid skimpy clothing such as crop tops or cycling shorts which do not properly cover your child's body.

Please note that Onside Coaches have informed us that, from September, girls will NOT be allowed to wear crop tops at Dance Club. Boys/girls at Football Club must also remember to bring their own shin pads.

## School Meals

We have been informed by our Catering Service, Educaterers that the price of a school meal, with effect from 1 September 2018, will be £2.20 per day (£11.00 per week)

#### Parents/Carers of Children in Year 2

Your child will have brought home a letter this week explaining that they are currently entitled to a free school meal under the Government's Universal Free School Meal Scheme and children from Reception class up to and including Year 2 are eligible.

In September 2018, if you wish your child to continue to have school meals, the cost will be £2.20 per day.

### Breakfast Club and Butterflies Club

If you are a current user of either our Breakfast Club or Butterflies After School Club, your child will have brought home a letter and new contract this week. We require you to complete and return a new contract for September 2018 to enable us to plan for adequate staffing. Please return all forms by 29 June 2018.

With effect from 1 September 2018 if you have booked a session in either breakfast or butterflies you will be charged for that session unless you have previously notified us of any cancellations (full details are set out in the letter and contract)

We have taken the decision to increase the price of both our Breakfast and Butterflies clubs with effect from 1 September in line with increasing costs for staffing, food and resources. With effect from 1 September 2018, the cost for breakfast club is £4 per day and the cost for butterflies club is £4 for one hour and £8.00 for two hours.

If you are not a current user of this service but require a place from September 2018, please ask the school office for a Contract.

We know that budgets are tight for many families and are committed to offering clubs at no cost which enrich our curriculum. We will soon be sending out our usual clubs' letter and will do our best to offer as many pupils as possible at least one free club of their choice.

# Y2 Yoga


Year Two kept cool this week by enjoying yoga sessions outside in the shade.
