














Farmer's Market

Swimming

Swimming and water safety are a statutory part of your child's education. The National Curriculum 2014 states that, by the end of the primary phase of education, all pupils must be able to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.
- Use a range of strokes effectively (for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.)
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

In order to ensure that school is meeting its statutory requirements and each pupil reaches the required standard, we are changing our arrangements for school swimming lessons.

As explained in the letter sent out this week to our current Y4 families, from September 2018 Year Five will swim all year. All pupils in Y5 JvS will swim during the Autumn Term and all pupils in Y5 CB during the Spring Term. In the Summer Term, children from both classes who have not yet met the required standard will swim (those pupils who are confident swimmers will remain in school to participate in a PE lesson led by Onside Coaches.)

Please note that there will no longer be school swimming lessons for Years Three and Four.


Extra-Special Superstars
