At Sydenham Primary School, pupils are taught to:


- Get excited about challenges.

Firework Safety Poem and Poster Competition 2017

Win a £25 book token and a visit to a Fire Station!

School children are invited to enter Warwickshire County Council Trading Standards and Fire & Rescue Service's annual Firework Safety Competition.

There are two competitions:

### Pre-School/Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 <u>Design a Firework Safety Poster</u>

Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6
Write a Firework Safety Poem or Rhyme and Decorate It

The aim of the competitions is to remind children about the dangers of fireworks.

Every year fireworks cause hundreds of avoidable injuries.

Around half of all injuries happen to children under the age of 16 years, many of whom may have ugly burn scars, for life.

The Two Competitions

Entry for Pre-School/Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children

Design a Firework Safety Poster

Posters should be colourful and designed to deliver a simple yet eye-catching firework safety message. Appropriate safety messages might include:



Stay a safe distance away from fireworks Sparklers stay hot after they go out Keep pets indoors Never give sparklers to the Under 5's Never put lit fireworks in your pocket Don't fool with fireworks Stay back – Fireworks burn

#### Entry for Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children

#### Write a Firework Safety Poem or Rhyme and Decorate It

Poems/Rhymes should be at least four lines long and also deliver a firework safety message. Children may decorate their entry if they choose to.



There will be ten winners, one poem winner and one poster winner for each district or borough.

Each winner will receive a prize of a £25 book token and a visit to a Warwickshire Fire Station.

In addition to their prize, they will also have their poster/poem enlarged and reprinted in time to be used as part of next year's campaign. An example winning poster from last year's competition is enclosed to display.

The winners will be chosen by Janet Faulkner, Group Manager of the Trading Standards Service and Assistant Chief Fire Officer Rob Moyney. The decision of the judges is final.

The closing date for entries is Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2017. This gives schools time to take part in the competition after half term and in the run up to 5<sup>th</sup> November, should they wish to.

Children can enter as many times as they wish but **must write their name**, **age**, **and school on the back of their posters**. All entries must be on A4 sized paper/card.
