














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

## Skip 2B Fit










The donated books can be taken home by children, free of charge, and either kept or returned to school for somebody else to enjoy. This helps to ensure that every family regardless of income, has access to books.

**Own Books are currently seeking volunteers** to collect books from the RSPCA charity shop and the Oxfam book shop on Regent Street in Leamington Spa. The books will need sorting in to three age ranges (pre-school, primary and secondary) before being delivered by the volunteers to the following schools: Sydenham, Kingsway, Kingsway Children's Centre, Shrubland Street and Whitnash.

Own Books pays 0.45p per mile to cover travel costs, paid monthly.

### Road Closure Postponed

You may have seen road signs this morning advising that Calder Walk is due to be closed for essential repairs to the gas mains. School has contacted the contractor (Cadent) who have informed us that the works are currently behind schedule so the closure of Calder Walk has been postponed. Cadent do not anticipate any work being undertaken for at least two weeks. We have requested that they meet with school leaders the week before the work begins to explain whether there are any implications for the gas supply to our kitchen and boilers.
