## Parking Complaint

I have been asked by the District Council to pass on the fact that they have received a complaint from a local resident regarding inconsiderate parking outside school.

The following information has been passed on by John Barrott, District Councillor:

"I have received a complaint from a resident on the Sydenham estate with regard to inconsiderate parking by parents dropping children off at the school. The resident, who is a shift worker, cannot get either off the drive to go to work or indeed get back when returning from work."

May I politely request that, where possible, children should walk, cycle or scoot to and from school. If you do need to drive, please park considerately and do not block driveways or pavements as this is very inconvenient to local residents. Poor parking is also a safety risk and can cause accidents so please think carefully about where you stop to drop off and pick up your children.
