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
# Our Learning Characters



When we think like our characters, we become learning super heroes!



## Information for the Forthcoming Year

### School Meals

A reminder that all infant children (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) are entitled to a free hot lunch. School dinners for juniors (years 3, 4, 5 and 6) cost £2.10.

### Footballs

A polite reminder that children should **not** be playing football in the playground before the school day to prevent other school children, toddlers, babies or parents getting hit by balls. Please help us by closely supervising your child / children in the playground before and after school. Thank you, in anticipation of your usual support. Children do not need to bring in footballs to use a break time—we will provide suitable balls.

### Year 3 Swimming

Year 3 will begin their swimming lessons at Newbold Comyn leisure centre next week. Miss Martin's class will swim every Monday (beginning September 12th) and Miss Ball's class will swim on a Tuesday (beginning September 13th.) The children will be travelling by coach. Swimming is a compulsory part of the curriculum, so please ensure your child has a swimming costume and towel with them. Lessons will cost £3.50 per week

### Library

For those parents and carers who have children that are new to the school, please note that we have a computerised library system at Sydenham. Staff will be scanning new children's thumb prints so that they can access their library account. Please contact your child's class teacher if you would like any further information about this system.

### Topic Letters

Each class teacher has published a 'Topic Letter' so that you can see what your child will be taught this term. Your child should have brought this letter home today. Please do not hesitate to see your child's class teacher if you would like any additional information.

### Early Birds Breakfast Club

A reminder that our school breakfast club runs from 8 O'Clock every morning, and now **costs £3 / session**, whatever time your child arrives. Children are served breakfast, including toast, cereal, croissants, eggs, bacon sandwiches, yogurts, fresh fruit, tea and fruit juice. Last food served at 8.40am. Please see Sarah, Kiran, Anna or Deb in the school office if you would like to book your child a place.

### Lateness and Absence

Please note that all children should be lined up in the school playground at 8.55am for the start of the school day. Please remember lateness causes disruption to all the children's learning and can cause children to feel upset and anxious. If you do arrive late, please note that children must come into school via the main reception / office area, and be signed in by an adult.

### Emergency Contact Details / Text Alert Service

It is **vital** that the school has up-to-date contact details for all parents and carers in case of an emergency situation. We also need your current mobile phone number so that you don't miss out on our text alert service. Please ensure you have informed the school office of any changes to your address or telephone numbers. Please also provide your email address so you can receive correspondence electronically. Thank you.

### Parking

Please park responsibly and legally **outside** the school when dropping off and collecting your child. Please show consideration for local residents and the safety of all children and families. Owing to the potential danger occasioned by the numbers of children and families using the school gates and the additional site traffic, you are reminded that it is absolutely

crucial that parents and carers do not use the school car park to drop off / collect their children at the start and end of the day. As pedestrians use this entrance / exit, it is highly dangerous for cars to be trying to use it as children are entering or leaving our site. Please park legally and responsibly to ensure the safety of all our children, with due consideration for our neighbours. Your co-operation is very much appreciated.

### Home Learning and Book Bags

Home learning is a wonderful way to become involved in your child's education. It also promotes time management and academic discipline as well as being a fun way to practise skills or find out new things.

Your child should already have received a new home learning book. Class teachers will stick homework into your child's book each week. We will try hard to give your child several suggested activities related to their learning in school, so that everyone feels able to achieve something. You may choose to do one or two of the suggested activities, or may find that you have time to do all of them! Please talk to your child's class teacher if you have any difficulties or concerns, or need to be able to access resources such as the internet in school. Home learning books will be sent home on Thursdays and must be returned by Tuesday.

Children will still be required to read regularly at home with you and given regular spellings to learn. Please make sure that your child brings his / her book bag to school every day. Please see your child's class teacher if you have any further queries or concerns about home learning.

### Medical Appointments

Please try to make medical / dental appointments out of school hours, so that your child does not miss out on any of her / his learning. Thank you, in anticipation of your support.



*Dear Parents,*

*We would like to say a very big thank you to those parents who have already started using ParentPay either to log on and activate their account or to make on line payments. We have already noticed the impact of having less cash in school.*

*If you would like any help in activating your account or require any training in making an online payment please call in to the school office where Sarah will be happy to assist you. If you have mislaid your letter with your username and password, we can supply you with a duplicate letter upon request.*

*We have some parents who have expressed an interest in making payments via a local Paypoint (McColls or Asda) and if you would like to use this service, please let the office know and we can order you a paypoint card.*

*As we are entering all payment items on to Parent Pay you can log in to your account and check if you have any outstanding balances and check the payments you have made. We urge you to log on to check your account regularly as if you do not agree with any of the outstanding balances we need to know as soon as possible.*



# Pupils go into print

THEY certainly have the gift of the gab at a Leafington school - and they have celebrated the fact by publishing a book.

Sydenham Primary School has more than 300 pupils speaking a combined 25 languages.

And when children's author Lee Sterrey visited and offered to help them write a book, staff and pupils knew there was only one topic they wanted it to focus on - celebrating their variety of cultures and languages.

The Unique Unicorn follows the story of a unicorn who feels different from all of the other unicorns on her planet. She then meets an alien who takes her to Sydenham Primary where she celebrates her uniqueness.

The story was the creation of both the author and pupils.

Lee - whose other books include Doyley the Dormouse and The Buttercup Game - said: "The biggest demand of the school was how to include all 310 pupils, which certainly created a challenge.

"The teachers were insistent that every child should be involved, such is the ethos of the school."

To help create the book, Lee - who lives locally - took a week of annual leave from her job at IBM and spent each day at the Calder Walk school.

She held a number of workshops, discussions, story-board and acting sessions, involving every child at the school.

The result is a book which is also full of 430 pieces of artwork and photos by the children to accompany the story.

She said: "We found a way to do it and I think the results are a tribute and celebration of Sydenham's achievements."

The book costs £6.99 and is available from Amazon.

The book was entered in to a national competition run by the NASUWT teacher's union. The competition, "Arts and Minds", celebrates cultural diversity and, this week, we received a letter and certificate explaining that **our book has been awarded a special commendation!** The judges of the competition said: ***"This is an amazing book. It looks at the importance of communication in a fun way and is an accessible read. We love the idea of the unicorns changing colour when they take on different ideas. It's nice to think this is a whole school project and the product of something that is a lot bigger. A truly fabulous piece of work."***

There are still have some copies of the book available to buy from school, priced £5 (you can buy the book on Amazon but it will be more expensive.) In addition, French and Roumanian translations of the book are now available to buy on Amazon. Thank you to Yeleen's mum and Tudor's mum for providing the translations.


