This place can be imaginary or real, inside or outside. Make sure you fill your special place with all the things you would like to help you relax.




- Make a big cartoon-style 'WOW!' in the middle of your sheet of paper.



Please pop along and take a look and remember that we are only able to accept cash payments. See you there!






If you are a parent/carer of a child in Reception, Year One or Year Two, you should have received a letter inviting you to watch your child's Christmas performance.


Breakfast and Butterflies Clubs
