

10 of Onside's finest will be tackling the peaks: Mark Morrey, Tom Sidwell, Pete Colins, Adrian Bevan, Steve Duffy, Harry Vaughan-Phillips, Claire Peet, Maxine Sedgley, Ella Keal and Zoe England.

By attempting the challenge, we are hoping to raise over £1,000 for the KIDS team at the Birmingham Children's Hospital - a charity that is very close to our hearts. The KIDS team provide a 24 hour referral, coordination, advice and transport service for critically ill babies and children in the West Midlands.

"Two years ago, when he was just 3 weeks old, our son Spencer stopped breathing and was taken to intensive care by the KIDS team (Kids Intensive Care and Decision Support). When a child has to be moved from one hospital to an intensive care unit they have to be taken by a specialist team who can intubate them (put them onto a life support machine). The KIDS team are part of Birmingham Children's Hospital and the only people able to do this in the West Midlands and Warwickshire. The team were amazing and so reassuring during the most difficult time of our lives. All of the money we raise will go directly to the KIDS team."

The Positive Parenting Programme





The programme is held over 8 weeks. Each session lasts for 2 hours during which you have the opportunity to discuss and plan strategies that can be put into practice at home.

The first session will be held at Sydenham Primary School on Thursday May 25th from 10.00am— 12.00pm



There will be 5 weekly group sessions followed by 2 weeks during which time you will have the opportunity to put the ideas you have learned into practice at home.

You will not be left alone to do this. Your Triple P trainer will be in contact to see how you are doing and to offer assistance if you are having difficulty. There is a final 2 hour session to review how well you have done and how to continue with all your good work!


