








Letter from JK Rowling

School Closure: Exceptional Circumstances

You should have received the following letter this week, via email, regarding the unfortunate closure of school on the day of the general election (June 8th.) In case, you missed the letter, a copy is published below for your information:

Exceptional School Closure due to UK Parliamentary Election Thursday 8th June 2017

Tuesday 2nd May, 2017.

Dear parents and carers,

Sydenham Primary School will be closed on Thursday 8th June because Warwickshire District Council will be using the school as a polling station for the UK Parliamentary General Election. The Education Act 1993 allows the District Council Returning Officer and Electoral Registration Officer the use of school as a polling station. Warwick District Council has considered using alternative locations, but believes that Sydenham is the venue which meets the needs of voters, and that there are issues with the nearest alternative venues. This Exceptional Closure day has been approved by the Department for Education because the closing of the school is outside the control of the school authorities due to the parliamentary election. The Department for Education guidance states that schools do not have to compensate for exceptional closures.

Sydenham is not able to remain open on polling day due to the safeguarding issues it would cause having members of the general public without DBS checks inside our particular school building with children inside. Additionally, we would be unable teach our P.E. lessons; to serve school dinners; or to fulfil our statutory responsibility to have Collective Worship due to the use of the school hall for voting. **Please accept our** sincere apologies for the disruption caused to pupils, parents and staff due to this exceptional closure.

Please note that, at Sydenham, we use school closure days due to elections as additional opportunities for staff training and development. This Thursday, for example, a Stage Director from the Royal Shakespeare Company will be training staff how to use their dynamic, active pedagogies to experience new ways of bringing Shakespeare to life for our pupils from Reception to Year 6 so that pupils can make and develop their own interpretations of Shakespeare. Unfortunately, like the rest of the general public, we were unable to predict that the Prime Minister would be calling a General Election this June. However, we shall be planning further training for staff on Thursday 8th June which will help us to continue to offer an outstanding curriculum and educational opportunities for our pupils.
