Parking



We have had several parents voicing concerns this week about families using the car park to drop off and pick up children from school. Please note that **the car park is for staff use only. Due to the number of children entering and leaving shool at the start and end of the day, it is not safe for families to park or pull up in the car park.** As the school grows in size, it is essential that all parents/carers respect this rule and park sensibly outside the school gates. Alternatively, please walk, cycle or scoot

your way to and from school.

A parent has also reported seeing a young child being driven off from the car park in a car without a booster seat. The Gov.uk website clearly states **the law** on this matter:

Children must normally use a child car seat until they're 12 years old or 135cm tall, whichever comes first.

Thank you in anticipation of your support in improving this matter.

Parent Pay Update

Thank you once again to the parents who have logged on to our new online payment system Parent-Pay and made payments to school. There are a small number of parents who still have not activated their accounts. If you have lost the original letter with your Username and Password, please call in to the school office and we can give these to you again or if you require some help in setting up your account we are very happy to help you.

A small number of parents have requested pay point cards which we have ordered for you. **Please note that these cards only allow you to make dinner money payments.** If you require a barcode to enable you to pay for a school visit or trip please contact the school office once you have received the letter regarding your child's trip. We can only issue you with a barcode once the trip has been arranged.

As we are no longer asking you to complete and return consent slips for trips and visits it is extremely important that you log in to your parent pay account to give consent. **We cannot take your child on a trip or visit without your prior consent.**

We are continuing to see a reduction of cash in school and we aim to become cashless by October half term. This decision has been made not only to reduce time receiving and recording cash but for the safety of our staff as we were receiving large amounts of cash in school each week. Making payment via Parent Pay also gives parents an instant record and receipt of their payments.

Entrance to the jumble sale is 50p and volunteer helpers are always appreciated!



This year's AGM will take place at school on Wednesday 12th October at 5.15 pm. Everybody is welcome!


