Great news! Sydenham has successfully joined The Royal Shakespeare Company's Associate School Programme. Places on this scheme are limited (only five Warwickshire schools were successful) so we are thrilled to have been chosen to participate. The aim of the programme is to introduce pupils to the work of William Shakespeare in exciting ways.

Being an Associate School brings our children lots of benefits such as:

- Being part of a local and national network of schools, teachers and theatre professionals committed to making Shakespeare's work vivid, accessible and enjoyable for pupils.
- Drama lessons and workshops with RSC Education practitioners.
- Opportunities to participate in a national festival of work by young people.
- Opportunities to experience high quality performances of Shakespeare's work in theatres and in school.

As part of the programme, on Friday 3rd February, Year 5 have been invited to watch a version of The Tempest at The Swan Theatre in Stratford. Afterwards, back at school, the children will participate in three masterclass, Shakespearian workshops, led by a Director Mentor from the RSC, culminating in their own performance of The Tempest at The Swan Theatre (part of The Play Making Festival.)

The Tempest: First Encounters



On a crazy island swirling with sounds, exiled Duke Prospero uses magic to create a home within the wilderness.

As his beloved daughter Miranda falls in love with a shipwrecked stranger from their homeland, she rebels against his power. Prospero must risk forgiving those who betrayed him, or lose her forever.

Fun, fantasy and sorcery collide in this gripping story of how love and reconciliation can conquer fear and control. It is an ideal first experience of Shakespeare for anyone aged eight and above. Using Shakespeare's original language, this edited version

last 90 minutes and includes a fully interactive introduction to the world of the play.

















ACTIVE ART'S PROJECT

On Tuesday, our Art's Committe met with staff from Warwick Art's Centre and pupil representatives from Kingsway, Shrubland Street, Clapham Terrace and St Patrick's primary schools. The purpose of the meeting was to agree arrangements for the CV31 "SPLAT!" art's festival which is due to take place in July.

Pupils were asked to make lots of decisions about the festival, such as:

- What will the programme of events be?
- What other activities and stalls will there be and how will they be accommodated in the space available?
- Do we need to fund raise to cover the cost of essentials such as security and first aid?
- Will the festival be free or shall we charge for tickets?
- How will we advertise the festival so lots of people come?

The children came up with some very thoughtful answers to these tricky questions. They also worked incredibly well in teams, listening carefully and valuing one another's opinions.



Y6 PERFORMANCE OF "MACDUFF"

On Wednesday, Y6 will be performing "Macduff" to parents and then children from local schools. We are very excited to be having theatrical lights (operated by a technician from Warwick Art's Centre) and costumes. The performance is being filmed by a professional camera man and will be screened at the festival in July. All Y6 parents/carers are invited to attend the first performance, at 9.15am in the school hall on Wednesday 18th January.

Y6 Visit to the Ashmolean Museum



On Wednesday, Year 6 visited the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford as part of their learning about the Ancient Greeks. The children looked at the antiquities on display and were lucky enough to handle artefacts which were thousands of years old!




