Looking at Learning: Religious Education

Learning about tolerance and respect for different faiths is an important part of our curriculum. Across Warwickshire, children follow a locally approved syllabus which focuses on Christianity as well as other world religions such as Sikhism, Islam, Hinduism and Buddhism. Lessons draw out the similarities between faiths as well as different ways of worship. Here's a snapshot of our RE lessons last week:





In Y1, pupils learnt about the role Puja plays in Hindu worship.



Children in Y2 were exploring what faith means. They went on to learn about Guru Nanak, the founder of the Sikh faith.

In Y3, pupils were learning about the story of Romulus and Remus. They made comparisons with the story of Moses.

In Y5, pupils were thinking about the different words that Christians use to describe their God.

The Y6 lesson explored the idea of a religious journey. Pupils worked in the Forest School area exploring important personal milestones.




