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Article 12: Respect of the views of the child

Attendance - our target is 97%

However, this actually means she is absent a whole day each week.

If she continues to attend at 80% then, over five years, she will miss the equivalent of a whole school year.

Top Tips to Improve Attendance and Avoid Lateness

- Encourage your child to be resilient and learn the difference between feeling a little under the weather or tired and actually being ill. Be assured—if your child is ill at school and needs to go home, we will contact you.
- Organise late nights, special outings and family events at the weekend or in the school holiday.
- Remember that days off in school time can only be granted in exceptional circumstances.
- Encourage your child to get their school belongings ready the night before and allow a spare five minutes in your schedule for those moments when things go wrong.

Why Good Attendance is Important

Good attendance is linked to high achievement. If your child is at school every day, you are promoting:

- Academic success
- Good social skills
- A positive work ethic
- Taking responsibility
