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Bullying is something that people do to hurt other people. It can be physical or emotional. It happens over and over again. It can happen online, in groups and to anyone, any time, anywhere.

Bullying involves something being done on purpose to cause hurt to another; it can be emotional pain or physical. It can be words or actions; if they are intended to to cause upset. It needs to be repeated after it has become clear that is it unacceptable and is upsetting someone.

Bullying is continuous, harmful behaviour that can hurt another person physically or mentally.

Bullying is something that happens over and over again. It can hurt your feelings and body. It is not ok and you must tell someone.
