Dear parents and carers,



## **Information for the Forthcoming Year**

## Footballs

A polite reminder that children should not be playing football in the infant playground before the school day to prevent other school children, toddlers, babies or parents getting hit by balls. Please help us by closely supervising your child / children in the playground before and after school. Thank you, in anticipation of your usual support. Children may bring soft balls into school to use at playtimes, but no hard, leather balls!

#### <u>Year 4 Swimming</u>

Year 4 will begin their swimming lessons at Newbold Comyn leisure centre on Tuesday 11th September. The children will be travelling by coach. Swimming is a compulsory part of the curriculum, so please ensure your child has a swimming costume and towel with them every Tuesday. Lessons will cost  $\pm 3.50$  per week

#### <u>Library</u>

For those parents and carers who have children that are new to the school, please note that we have a computerised library system at Sydenham. Staff will be scanning new children's thumb prints so that they can access their library account. Please contact your child's class teacher if you would like any further information about this system.

## **Topic Letters**

Each class teacher has published a 'Topic Letter' so that you can see what your child will be taught this term. Your child has been given one of these to bring home today. Please do not hesitate to see your child's class teacher if you would like any additional information.

## Early Birds Breakfast Club

A reminder that our school breakfast club runs from 8 O'clock every morning, and now **costs £3 per session**, whatever time your child arrives. Children are served breakfast, including toast, cereal, croissants, eggs, bacon sandwiches, yogurts, fresh fruit, tea and fruit juice. Last food served at 8.40am. Please see Sarah, Kiran or Deb in the school office if you would like to book your child a place.

I appreciate that this is quite a hike in price from previous years but, unfortunately, we no longer receive any additional funding to subsidise the club, and have had to bring prices in line with other school breakfast clubs in order to cover staffing, food & utilities costs.

## Lining Up in the Playground

We appreciate that the infants' playground has been especially busy this week due to all of the additional adults supporting the new Reception children. Staff will be out early on the playground on Monday to show children new lining up position to help ease the 'traffic'!

#### Lateness and Absence

Please note that all children should be lined up in the school playground at 8.55am for the start of the school day. Please remember lateness causes disruption to all the children's learning, and can cause children to feel upset and anxious. If you do arrive late, please note that children must come into school via the main reception / office area, and be signed in by an adult.

## Emergency Contact Details / Text Alert Service

It is **vital** that the school has up-to-date contact details for all parents and carers in case of an emergency situation. We also need your current mobile phone number so that you don't miss out on our text alert service. Please ensure you have informed the school office of any changes to your address or telephone numbers. Thank you.

#### <u>Parking</u>

Please park responsibly and legally outside the school when dropping off and collecting your child. Please show consideration for local residents and the safety of all children and families! Please note that the car park is for the use of site staff only.



# Parking

Owing to the potential danger occasioned by the numbers of children and families using the school gates and the additional site traffic, you are reminded that it is absolutely crucial that parents and carers do not use the school car park to drop off / collect their children at the start and end of the day. As pedestrians use this entrance / exit, it is highly dangerous for cars to be trying to use it as children are entering or leaving our site. Unfortunately, I have already received a telephone call from one concerned local resident about parents stopping their cars in the middle of the road for children to get out. Please park legally and responsibly to ensure the safety of all our children, with due consideration for our neighbours. Your co-operation is very much appreciated.

## Home Learning and Book Bags

Research over a number of years in this and other countries has shown that home learning can make an important contribution to pupils' progress at school. An OFSTED Report published in 1995 confirmed that many pupils and their parents saw learning done at home as a valuable and essential part of school work.

The Government believes that there is enormous advantage in children spending regular periods of time on different learning activities devised by schools, as part of a home learning programme which supports the work they do in class.

Your child should already have received a new home learning book and a piece of stickyback plastic (very Blue Peter!) to cover it. Class teachers will stick homework into your child's book each week. We will try hard to give your child several suggested activities related to their learning in school, so that everyone feels able to achieve something. You may choose to do one or two of the suggested activities, or may find that you have time to do all of them! Please talk to your child's class teacher if you have any difficulties or concerns, or need to be able to access resources such as the internet in school. Home learning books will be sent home on Thursdays and must be returned by Tuesday. Children will still be required to read regularly at home with you and given regular spellings to learn. Please make sure that your child brings his / her book bag to school every day. Please see your child's class teacher if you have any further queries or concerns about home learning. We appreciate that home learning can present difficulties for some families, and that children sometimes need access to a computer, the internet and books. There will be a 'home learning club' running this term, to try to alleviate some of these potential barriers to home learning.

A reminder that the closing date for applications for Reception Class places for September 2014 is 15th January 2014.
