Marle Hall

"It was quite an experience buying sacks of rice, drums of cooking oil, salt, pepper and onions, finding a vehicle to transport these things to the school and a man to load and unload the goods. Mr Jarju the headteacher supported us in our mission and made sure we were charged a fair price. Once in Kwinella we could see evidence of how providing food not only helps the children nutritionally but also increases attendance. For some children the meal



at school is the only meal they receive. We met several parents bringing their children to register for a place after hearing about and seeing the delivery. Everyone was immensely grateful for the support we were able to provide. And would like to say thank you to Lighthorne Heath and Sydenham for their support."
