Bikeability Level 1

22 Children in years 3 and 4 took the opportunity to take part in free level 1 cycle training yesterday morning. They learned some important lessons and practised essential skills in the safe environment of the school playground. Thank you to the Central Warwickshire School Bikeability Team. Rajan: We learned about riding with one hand and clapped the teacher's hand. It was harder with me to put my left hand out.

I also learnt to use my brakes quickly. We did an emergency stop.

Bethany: First we did a clothes check and then we did a bike check. Thomas We learnt to zig-zag through the cones and we had to look behind our right shoulder and say what colour the cone was.

Thomas: You do the M check from the back wheel, up the body and down to your chain and pedals, then up again to where your brakes and handle bars are and then down to the front wheel.

Important Information: There are only **12 places** available for free <u>years 5 and 6</u>
Bikeability lessons. As they take place on the road the instructors will need to know in advance whether we need more places, so they can book another trainer. It is important therefore that all forms are retuned to school by Friday 1st May. Thank you for your cooperation.

The course takes place on the following dates: Monday 15th June to Thursday 18th June.

Monday session is on the playground, then the rest of the sessions take place on the road. All children must have a helmet.
