## Teachers' Industrial Action

We have been informed by NUT and NASUWT that they will be taking industrial action in the form of a strike on Tuesday 1st October (provisionally). This action is not against the school itself but is part of national industrial action organised by these trades unions about changes to pay and conditions. There is no requirement on unions to inform us of which members of staff will take action, and it may be that they will not know themselves as there is no obligation on members of unions to obey a strike call. Neither the governing body nor the Head Teacher is legally allowed to close the school 'in sympathy' with the strike and we will not do so. However, our main concern is the safety of our students. The school will only close if in the opinion of the Head Teacher it is not safe to remain open. If it does remain open, we shall endeavour teach classes as normal, although this may not be possible. If action is prolonged, we will endeavour to protect the education of all our pupils. Because we may not know until very late how many staff will be available to work, the decision to close may have to be taken at the last minute. Every effort will be made to give notice at the latest by the day before; but in case the decision has to be made on the day itself, we are asking parents to nominate a place of safety, which may be your home, to which your child can go if we have to close. We must all hope that the issues over which the industrial action has arisen

resolved as soon as possible.

# Polite Request




How the cat purred and how the witch grinned As they sat on their broomstick and flew through the wind
