Year 5 and 6 visit to the National Gallery

The children were delighted to visit the gallery and see their work on display. Some even saw pictures of themselves reading their work. The book itself was displayed in a class case and photographs of the pages were displayed alongside.

They also enjoyed seeing the painting they had studied 'St Michael triumphant over the devil' by Bartolome Bermejo in real life. One of the staff at the gallery talked to the childrenchidren about the painting and they learned even more.









Leamington Federation of Sydenham Primary School and Lighthorne Heath Primary School, Warwickshire

The gloan was to expose the characteristic new techniques and expose the characteristic techniques and materials with no prescribed outcomes. The children's hand-bound book represents a logbook of ideas and images which evolved from the painting's energy. The children experimented with marbling to add depth and pattern to paper they made. Next, we began a printing workshop inspired by ideas formulated in creative writing. The children mono-printed, collographer and experimented with layering prints and chalks to intensify their illustrations. They also used several old typewriters, typing out thoughts and ideas for inclusion in the final book. The batik hot wax, teiting rollers and the use of an old sewing machine were also successful experiments.


The real story is how we came across the picture!
