

# Caring for our planet



This week, the theme for our assemblies was 'Caring for Our Planet'. This theme supports our teaching of the Unicef Rights of the Child, namely Article 29: Education should include the development of respect for the natural environment.

During the Infants assembly, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 talked about what they could see in these photos; what made these places special; and how they would feel if they were there.







The children immediately noticed how green everything was, and enjoyed looking carefully at how these spaces could be used.

We then thought about what our planet would look like if we are not so careful, and read 'Greta and The Giants' by Zoe Tucker. It is a brilliant books which tells the story of a little



girl called Greta (based on Greta Thunberg, the environmental activist) who persuades the giants to stop destroying the forest so that it can be a home for all of the creatures.





It was lovely to hear the children's ideas during and after the assembly:

This is why we have Eco reps!

I always turn the taps off if someone has left them on.

We need to keep our planet clean.

We need to put our rubbish in the bin, otherwise it can harm the animals



We can walk to school instead of drive.

We can grow flowers in our gardens for the bees and butterflies.


#### Re: Flu vaccination programme for school aged children
