The Paper Bag Princess



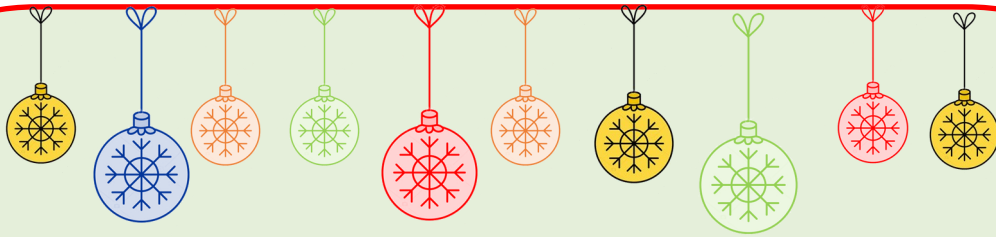
Year Two have been learning the classic 'Girl Power' story of 'The Paper Bag Princess' by Robert Munsch.

Y3 CR

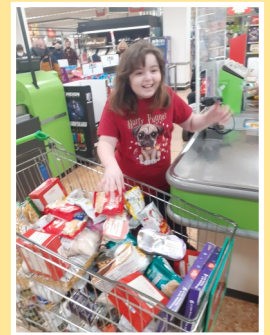
