

Home Learning Heroes



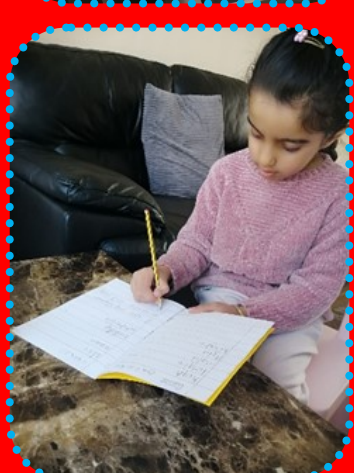
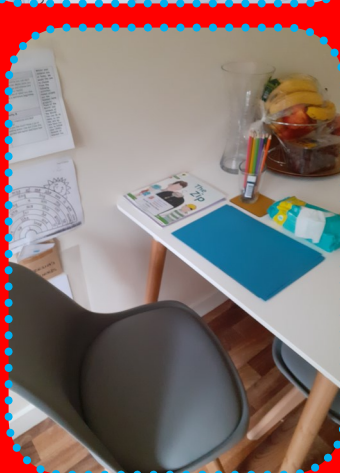
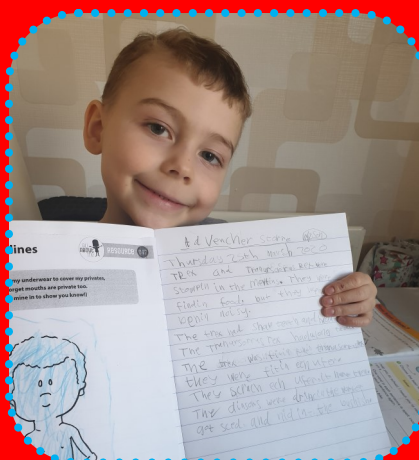
