Animal Experience

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 3 had a very exciting visit this week from a range of African animals, including a giant snail, tenrec, meerkat, tortoise, gecko, bearded dragon and even a python! The children were incredibly brave and curious, with many of them having the chance to hold or carefully touch the animals.

This experience linked brilliantly to several of our Science topics on animals, helping the children look closely at features such as shells, scales, claws, tails, feet and skin. It gave children a real-life opportunity to compare animals, ask questions and think about how different body parts help animals move, protect themselves and survive in their habitats.



These sessions also helped pupils understand that animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. They also supported discussion around animal nutrition and the diets needed by different species.

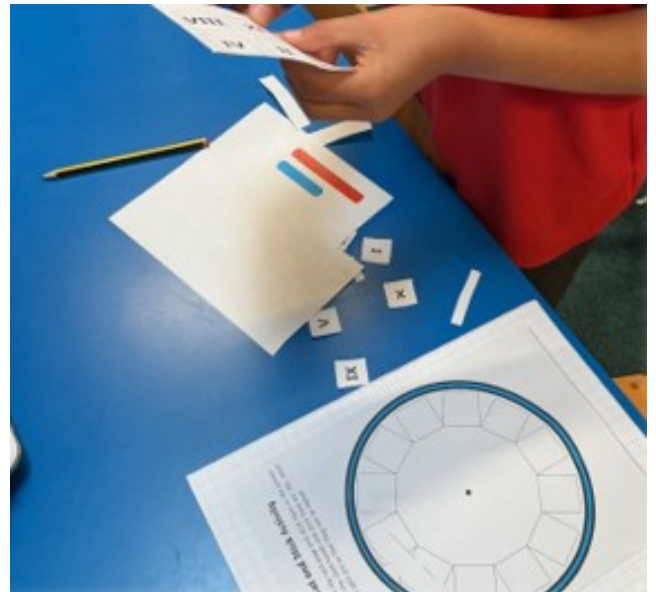
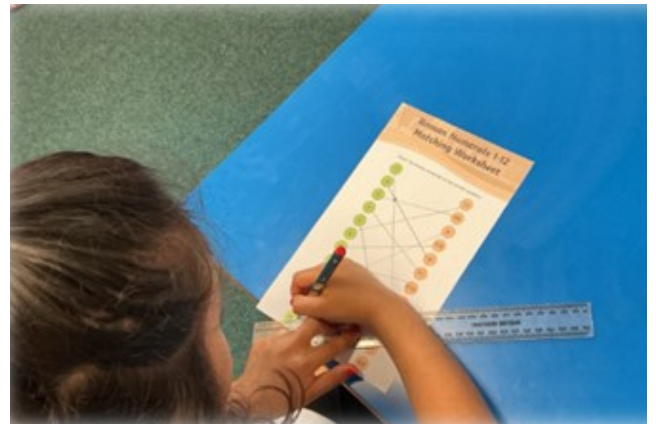

This week, Year 3 have been exploring Roman numerals and their use on analogue clocks. The children learned how Roman numerals represent numbers and practised reading and writing the numerals from I to XII. They then applied this knowledge to tell and write the time using analogue clocks featuring Roman numerals.

The children enjoyed identifying patterns within the numeral system and making connections between Roman numerals and the clocks they see in everyday life. They demonstrated great perseverance when reading different times and explaining how they knew the correct answer.

This learning links directly to the Year 3 National Curriculum for Mathematics, which requires pupils to tell and write the time from analogue clocks, including those using Roman numerals from I to XII, and to use the 12-hour and 24-hour clock. Developing these skills helps children build confidence with time, problem-solving and real-life mathematical applications.

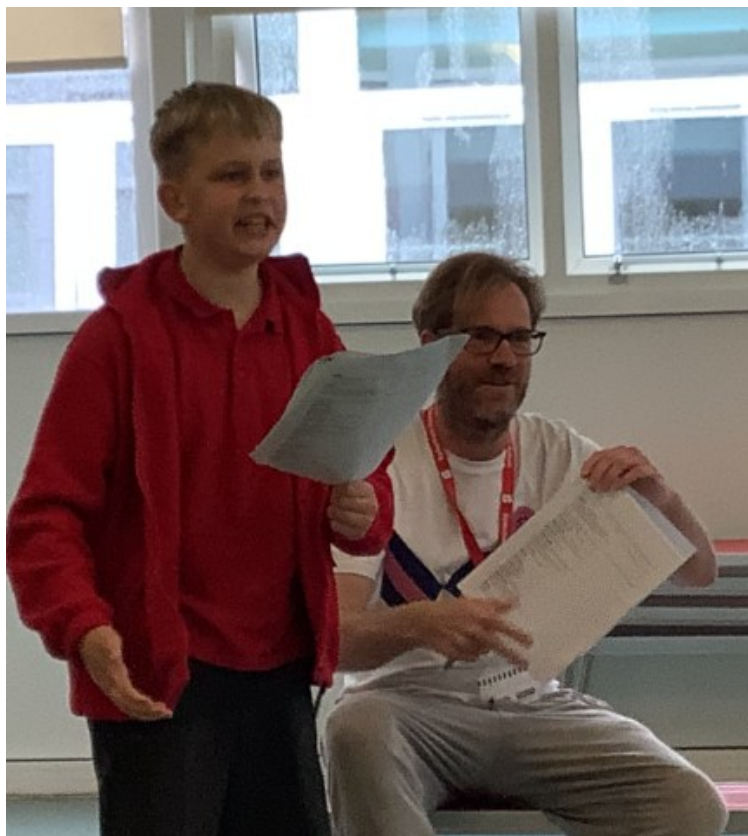
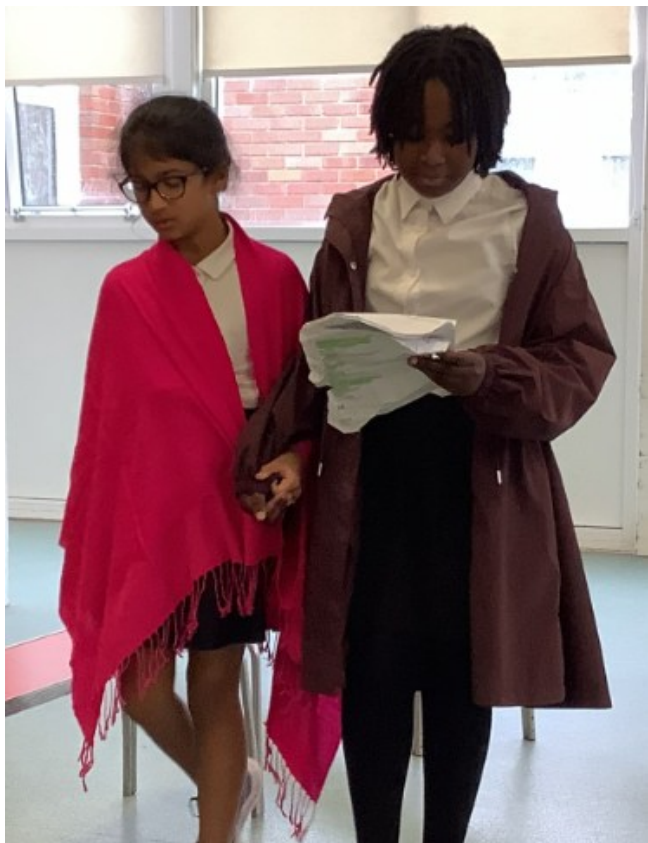

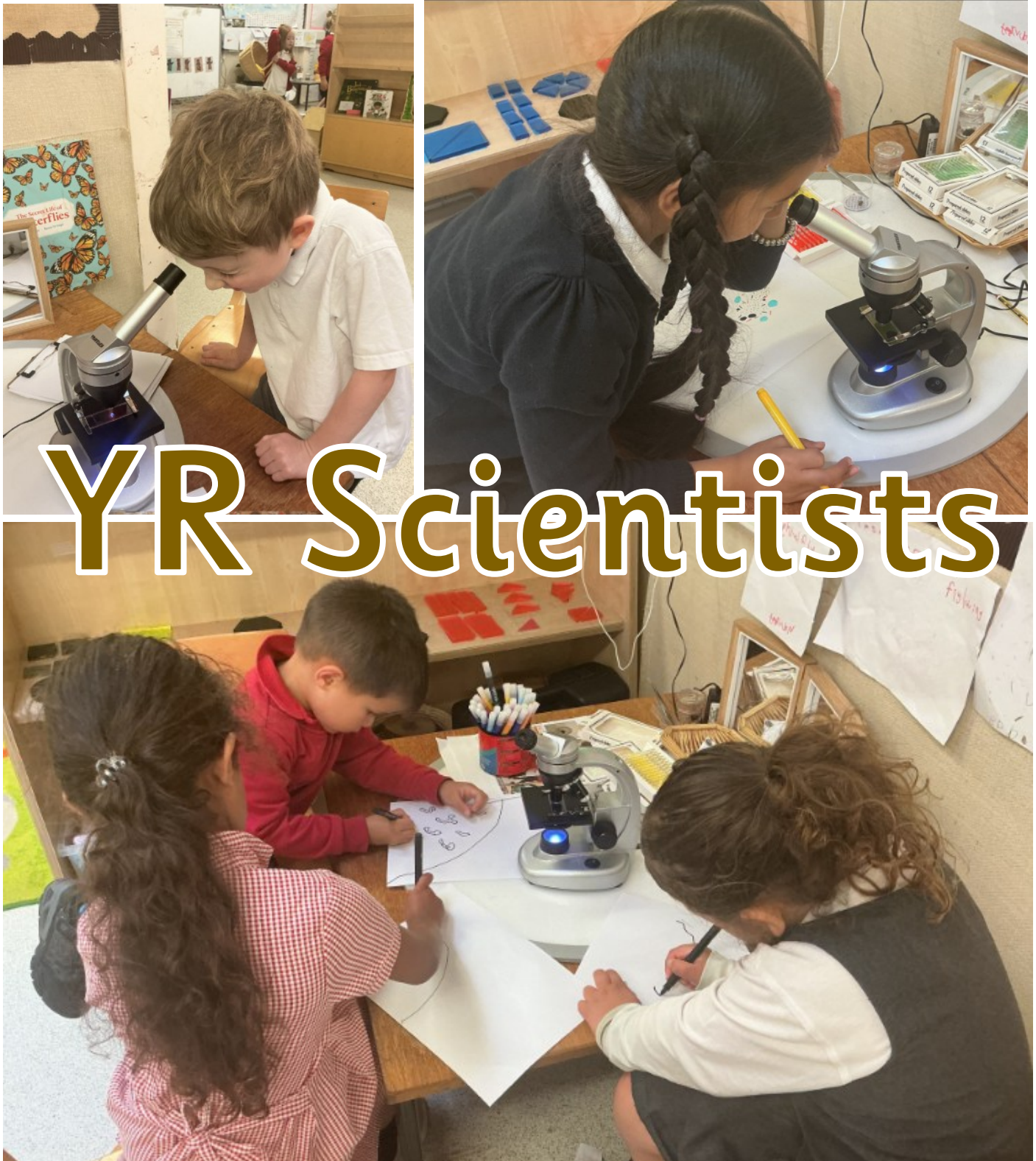
