They created these lovely pictures based on the story using a water colour wash and animal silhouettes. Well done!














Through the Magic Door




Thinking of Others



Magical Potions





School Meal Vouchers

Edenred school meal vouchers are currently still being funded for our families entitled to a free school meal, whose children are not in school. We receive regular updates from the Department for Education and Edenred who run the scheme and will notify you of any changes to this as and when applicable.

We have been notified that with effect from 1 June the expiry date for vouchers has been reduced from four months to two months. Please ensure you redeem your vouchers as soon as you receive the email to avoid them expiring .

Please note, we have been advised by Edenred the website to redeem your vouchers will undergo essential maintenance from 8 am on 13 June until 7 pm on 14 June and you will not be able to access it during this time

Univeral Infant Free School Meals

If your child is in Year 2 you will have received a letter via email this week informing you that when your child moves to Year 3, school dinners will be chargeable unless you are registered with the free school meals scheme. Please contact the school office if you require any assistance with applying for free school meals
