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


First Encounters















### First Encounters



Year Three have continued to learn more about the science of light and how shadows are created. This week they carried out an investigation they had planned to find out that happens to the size of a shadow when the opaque object blocking the light source is moved.

Pupils made sure their investigation was fair by only changing one variable. They also developed their disciplinary knowledge through observing carefully, taking repeat measurements, recording results systematically, discussing findings and drawing a conclusion.

The children concluded: "If your light source moves closer to the opaque object, the shadow increases in size."


# Knitting Club

**Reception** - The Ugly Duckling; The Billy Goat's Gruff; Goldilocks and the Three Bears; The Gingerbread Man; Jack and the Beanstalk; Chicken Licken; The Enormous Turnip; The Princess and the Pea; Sleeping Beauty

**Year One** - Little Red Riding Hood; The Three Little Pigs; The Little Red Hen; Cinderella; Tiddalik the Frog

**Year Two** - The Elves and the Shoemaker; Hansel and Gretel; Rapunzel; Jack and the Baked Bean Stalk; Goldiluck and the Three Pandas; The Princess and the Pea; The Snow Queen

#### Story boxes:

Story boxes open out to reveal a scene from the story inside. They contain characters and props that children can use to help to retell a story. Please could we ask that the boxes used to make a story box, if that is your preference, are no bigger than a standard shoe box!







#### Story jars:

Story jars remain closed once they are complete, but peeking inside reveals which book they are representing. They contain certain items, quotes or clues about the story.







Please ensure your story box or jar is carefully labelled **on the bottom** with your child's name and class, and the title of the book. Please bring them into school by Friday 1st March at the latest.
