





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British Science Week

For British Science Week, Y6 learnt about the circulatory system and the important role blood plays in transporting substances around the body. They discovered that blood is made up of several constituent parts: plasma, the liquid that carries nutrients and waste; red blood cells, which transport oxygen; white blood cells, which help fight infection; and platelets, which help the blood to clot.

To support their understanding, pupils created a replica blood by carefully measuring and mixing ingredients in a beaker. They used oil, syrup and water to represent the different components, combining them in the correct proportions to show how blood is made up of several parts working together.





British Science Week



As part of British Science Week, Year 3 pupils investigated soil to find out what it is made of. Using hand lenses, they carefully observed samples and separated the soil into its different parts. The children discovered a range of natural materials, including leaves, twigs and even snail shells hidden within the soil. They recorded their findings using both written descriptions and labelled diagrams, showing their observations like real scientists.



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Assembly - YR Robins



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Year Five have been enjoying studying Ancient Greek myths, especially Homer's "The Odyssey." This week, they made freeze frames of a pivotal moment in the epic story—when Odysseus reveals himself to his enemies on his return home from Ithaca.





Year One have been learning about healthy eating and the importance of having a balanced diet. As part of their learning, the pupils adapted **“If You’re Happy and You Know It”** and turned it into their very own healthy eating song, which they thoroughly enjoyed performing.

- Five calm cows.



At the zany zoo I could see:


