These children took part in the Summer Reading Challenge, and completed their challenge sheets over the holidays. What a lot of children we have to be proud of!














































































































What an amazing effort, and what a joy to see so many children feeling so proud of their reading achievements.


Christmas Theatre Visit Reception, Year 1 and Year 2


