Pupils enjoyed exploring the town and meeting people in role as its inhabitants.






Children visited the bank and swapped their modern money for pennies, shillings and farthings. They could spend their money in the old fashioned shops.

They made their own quick drawings of each artwork and then discussed what the artists were trying to convey.


The children then took a close look at two of the paintings. They studied each one carefully and thought about the colours, light and composition.





Afterwards, the Ambassadors discussed which of the two paintings would be the most exciting for Reception and Y1 to study.


After much debate, they made their decision. Their choice is top secret and will be revealed soon!




Reception have been studying portraits of Queen Elizabeth II. They drew their own pictures in response.




