Article 19: Protection from Violence, Abuse and Neglect.

Y1 learnt about about birds and how some of them travel to different countries. The children made links with the books, "The Suitcase' and "My Name is Not Refugee" and they began to reflect that people may need to leave their homes to take refuge.

Pupils went on to create unique bird art sculptures to represent the theme of journeys. The children thought their sculptures would create a welcoming and colourful space for newcomers to our country.






A dining table for everyone to share and enjoy food together.

Beds that are comfortable for everyone to rest in.


A library with books full of different languages.

A hospital/ medical room to help anyone who arrives that is unwell.


A key to the attic because the door is always open for anyone who needs a shelter or a friend.




