

Across the school, pupils participated in The National Gallery's "Take One Picture Project" this week



Pupils were interested in the setting of the painting—a farmyard. They collected leaves, seeds and twigs from outdoors and thought about their colour, shape and texture.

The children also thought about the ray of light shining down the middle of the painting. They made cyanotypes pictures activated by sunlight. The pictures will be added to the banner. The banner will hang in the window of The Pump Rooms when finished.

Pupils mixed their own paints from natural materials using the same palette as the artist who created "The Prodigal Son." They printed on to muslin squares which will be sewn together to make a banner.


Year Four

NATIONAL GALLERY



Y4 have been exploring "A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas" and were fascinated by the duality in the painting. The painter included lots of pairs like the boats, the birds and the lightning and the painting is one of a pair too. Children loved the contrast between light and dark (the blue sky and the red lightning) and wanted to explore the theme of light/dark. After discussion, lots of children suggested that one boat could be good and one could be bad or that one boat was heading for salvation while one went to hell!

Pupils started to plan a design for a clay sculpture and the class decided they would like to create a statue showing an angel on one side and a demon on the other. They started to develop their clay techniques by making push pots and then using these to create hollow sculptures.





Special Assembly

On Tuesday, Key Stage Two welcomed a special visitor into their assembly. Nahed Alhamwi is Syrian born and was granted refugee status four year's ago. Nahed is a qualified civil engineer but was forced to flee her home when war broke out and it was no longer safe to remain in the country. Although Nahed found a safe haven, initially in the Lebanon, her elderly parents were forced to stay behind. After seven years in a camp for asylum seekers, Nahed finally received refugee status and relocated to Britain.

By the time Nahed arrived in Britain, she was married with two children but nobody in her family could speak English. Nahed explained that this was frightening but the warm reception her family received was overwhelming. When her children started school, they were able to use the international language of the smile to make friends and now they are all fluent in English. Nahed currently works to help other refugee and asylum seekers and she hopes to resume her carer as an engineer once her children are a little older.

This was a really inspiring assembly and it was a privilege for the children to meet Nahed and hear her story. What shone through Nahed's talk was the importance of kindness, empathy and understanding—all values we cherish at Sydenham.

Year Four worked with textile artist Julia Snowdin on Thursday to create artworks for display in our pop-up gallery at "Art in the Park." Pupils learnt how to felt and created beautiful felt and embroidery landscapes.

Year Two School Meals

If you have a child in Year 2, you will be aware that they are entitled to a school meal under the Universal Infant Free School Meal scheme. As the entitlement applies to children in Year R, Year 1 and Year 2 only, this entitlement will end for your child on 21 July 202. If you would like your child to continue to have a school meal in September, the cost per day is £2.30. Please see the letter sent home this week via email for further information. You will continue to receive a free school meal if you have previously registered with the free school meals office. Please contact the school office if you are unsure if you are currently registered.

School Meal Pricing

We have today been informed by our external catering company that the cost of a school meal will increase with effect from September 2022 to $\pounds 2.30$ per day.
