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
# Year Four Trip

## Introducing our KS2 home reading incentive



We encourage every child to read at least four times a week, and are introducing a new incentive for our pupils in Key Stage 2. Every Friday, children in Year 3-6 will have the chance to take home one of these wonderful poetry bags for the weekend. Inside the bag will be a poetry book chosen by your child, a pallet of paint, colouring pencils and an art pad. Your child is encouraged to read some of the poems in the book and to pick a favourite one. They can then do a drawing or painting that would go well with their chosen poem. 
### Christmas Theatre Visit Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

### Christmas Theatre Visit Year 5 and Year 6


