After the tour, there was a planning session and three special projects were arranged:

- In the Spring Term, every class will take part in digital lessons led by the gallery. All pupils will make a beautiful zig-zag sketchbook.
- In the Summer Term every class will create artwork inspired by a painting, print or sculpture on display at the gallery. Hopefully, some of the work will be displayed for the public to see.













Louella's Rapunzel Book

We'e delighted to be able to take our children to the theatre this term to see a variety of performances. Please see below for details of each trip.

Reception and Year One

On Thursday 16 December, Reception and Year 1 will visit Warwick Arts Centre to see The Very Hungry Caterpillar. We will leave school after registration and return to school in time for lunch. The cost of the trip is \pounds 12.95 and is available in your ParentPay account.

Years Two and Year Three

On Thursday 25 November, Years 2 and 3 will visit the Belgrade Theatre to see a performance of Beauty and the Beast. The performance begins at 10.15 and we will travel to and from the theatre within the school day. The cost of the trip is \pounds 16.50 and is available in your ParentPay account.

Year Four (just confirmed)—letter coming soon!

On Tuesday 2 December, Year 4 will visit the Royal Shakespeare Theatre to see a performance of the Magician's Elephant. Children will leave school at 12 noon and will return to school at approximately 4.30 pm. The cost of the trip is £16.50. You'll be able to log in to your ParentPay account to give consent and make payment very soon. You'll be able to either pay in full or in instalments.

Years Five and Six

On Tuesday 14 December, Years 5 and 6 will visit the Royal Shakespeare Theatre to see a performance of the Magician's Elephant. Children will go home from school at 3.20 pm and return to school at 5.45 pm to take the coach to the theatre. We will return to school at approximately 10.00 pm and you should arrive promptly to pick up your child(ren). Your child(ren) can come in to school the following morning a little later to allow for the late return home. Further details will follow regarding this. The cost of the trip is £16.50 and is available in your ParentPay account.

Monday: Street Dance for Years 1 to 6

Street Dance club will give children an opportunity to learn a themed dance routine; helping them to consolidate and progress skills learnt. Street Dance Club is a great way of getting children active and encouraging a healthy lifestyle whilst providing a mixture of learning and fun. There will be a showcase on the last session.

Tuesday: Ballet for Years 1 & 2

Ballet club is a great way to improve balance, coordination and posture. It is fantastic to help develop fitness and moving whilst enhancing flexibility and muscular strength. In ballet club children will learn the basic ballet exercises and then move onto to learning unique choreographed routines designed by the teacher. Ballet uniform will be provided by the school. There will be a ballet showcase on the last session.

Wednesday: Football for Years 1 & 2

Football club will focus on gaining skills and confidence for all children and help develop children's knowledge further. Children will learn skills such as dribbling, passing, shooting and control. Each week the club will focus on ball skills and techniques and will end with small-sided games. All children will require Shin Pads.
