

On Tuesday evening, pupils in Years Five and Six visited The Royal Shakespeare Theatre in Stratford to watch a performance of Charles

This is a funny, surprising, exciting and sometimes scary show about Scrooge, a miserable man who cares only about himself and his business. Can you believe it? He hates Christmas! But all that changes when he meets three spirits who teach him to change his "bah humbug" attitude and become a nicer person.

The show includes incredible acting, especially from Beth Alsbury who plays Mr Hinge and Adrian Edmondson who is Scrooge. We loved that fact that the cast includes actors with disabilities and we enjoyed the wheelchair dancing.





Run, Run, as Fast as You Can






Half term reading challenge!
