











Y6 Blood Heart






Y2 Lighthouses

As we approach the end of the financial year, I would be most grateful if you could log in to your parent pay accounts and settle any outstanding balances.


If your child has a school meal can we politely request that all meals booked during the period 1-12 March 2021 are paid for either in advance or on the day they are booked.




