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

Poems can be about making us laugh, making us smile and making us cry.


Writing amazing poems makes us feel calm and proud.

#### Easter Egg Raffle

If you have not already done so, please log in to Parentpay to be in with a chance to win one of our delicious Eggs. One ticket costs 50p but you can enter more than once if you wish . Please note that if you are purchasing more than one ticket, enter the amount in parent pay as 50p and then the quantity of tickets you wish to purchase. Parent pay will then calculate the amount for you to pay. (*Please check this amount is correct before you pay.*)

#### <u>MUFTI Day</u>

We have added today's MUFTI as a payment item in Parent Pay. We hope this makes it more convenient for you to donate to our School Fund as not all of you will carry cash. If you have more than one child at our school, please visit each child's account to make the payment as we have set the payment amount to 50p.

Parent Pay do charge a payment service fee for each payment made to them. This means we will not achieve the full 50p donation so this is a trial for this month's MUFTI day . You can of course continue to donate in cash if this suits you . We are more than happy to receive your thoughts and comments on your preferred payment method

#### <u> Parent Pay</u>

Parent Pay now offers a "bank transfer" facility. Please bear in mind that if you use this option your payment can take up to 10 working days to reach us. We will not be able to issue any refunds or make any adjustments until this payment has cleared. Please also bear in mind that as the payment can take a while to reach us, for the payment to be successful you must have the funds in your account on the day it arrives with us not on the day you make the bank transfer. We are always happy to make refunds and/or adjustments for families that have made an error with their payments but please bear in mind the above. We do find that if you use any of the alternative payment methods in parent pay other than "bank transfer" we are able to offer a far more efficient refund or adjustment service to you
